By 2030 the UN want to:

Target 16.1: Significantly reduce all forms of violence and related death rates everywhere.

Target 16.2: End abuse, exploitations, trafficking and all forms of violence against and torture of children.

Target 16.3: Promote the rule of law at the national and international levels and ensure equal access to justice for all.

Target 16.4: Significantly reduce illicit financial and arms flows, strengthen the recovery and return of stolen assets and combat all forms of organized crime.

Target 16.5: Substantially reduce corruption and bribery in all their forms.

By 2030 the UN want to:

Target 16.6 Develop effective, accountable and transparent institutions at all levels.

Target 16.7 Ensure responsive, inclusive, participatory and representative decision-making at all levels.

Target 16.8 Broaden and strengthen the participation of developing countries in the institutions of global governance.

Target 16.9 Provide legal identity for all, including birth registration.

Target 16.10 Ensure public access to information and protect fundamental freedoms, in accordance with national legislation and international agreements.



16.a: Strengthen relevant national institutions, including through international cooperation, for building capacity at all levels, in particular in developing countries, to prevent violence and combat terrorism and crime.

16.b: Promote and enforce non-discriminatory laws and policies for sustainable development.

Facts and Figures

- The number of refugees of concern to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) stood at 13 million in mid-2014, up from a year earlier.
- Corruption, bribery, theft and tax evasion cost some US \$1.26 trillion for developing countries per year.
- The rate of children leaving primary school in conflict-affected countries reached 50% in 2011, which amounts to 28.5 million children.
- Human trafficking affects every country of the world, as country of origin, transit or destination. Victims from at least 127 countries have been found to be exploited in 137 States.



Irish organisations making a difference

Trócaire is the overseas development agency of the Catholic Church in Ireland. It was established in 1973 as a way for Irish people to donate to development and emergency relief abroad. Their dual mandate is to support the most vulnerable people in the developing world, while also raising awareness of injustice and global poverty at home.

Trócaire works with partners in the Occupied Palestinian Territory (OPT) and Israel to support those affected by conflict and human rights violations, as well as helping to raise international awareness around the injustice of human rights violations.
