Colombia is promoting sustainable consumption as part of its national Green Growth Strategy.



In 2016, Samoa elected more women to its parliament than ever before and appointed its first female deputy prime minister.



Trinity College Dublin to become disposable plastic free zone



Estonia was the first EU country to fulfill its 2020 renewable energy targets, and it has plans to invest in more wind energy.



Legislative bodies in the Philippines are working to mandate health and nutrition standards for the first 1,000 days of life.

Montenegro is implementing a new national plan to manage its coastal areas and promote sustainable tourism.

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In Uganda, more girls are gaining financial security through new efforts ensuring their right to inherit property.



A UNICEF/Living Water project in April brought drinking water to a school in Sierra Leone for the first time in 10 years.



Norway will provide US\$48 million to fund schools in Syria and its neighbouring countries for the period 2016-2018.



Egypt's Social Housing Programme is set to replace 150,000 housing units in slum areas by 2018.



In 2016, the Republic of Korea launched its "Safe Life for All" initiative that will spend US\$100 billion on eradicating infectious diseases and improving health systems around the world.

The Noor energy plan in Morocco will build five solar power plants by 2020, saving 3.7 million tonnes of CO2 emissions per year.
